## **Use of Proposition 56 Funding: 2019-2020 Appropriation**

In 2018, University of California Health (UCH) entered into an agreement with Physicians for a Healthy California (PHC) for the purpose of developing, administering, and managing a statewide Graduate Medical Education (GME) grant program (known as "CalMedForce") created and funded by Proposition 56.

Application Period: September 23, 2019 through October 28, 2019

Award notification: November 25, 2019

**Total award amount:** \$38,085,000

First payment to 2019-2020 awardees sent/approved in Fall of 2020. Subsequent payments, over the course of three or four years, are made upon approval of required reports per the CalMedForce program.
