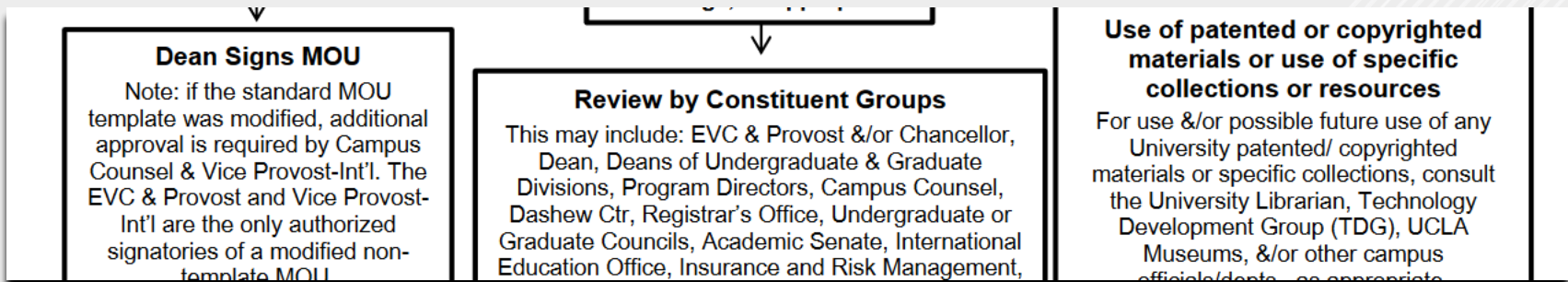
Collaborate with research, legal, risk, among others, on **compliance** with relevant federal, state, and international regulations and guidance.
