ENSURE STUDENT SUCCESS FOR ALL

- Professional students were far more likely than academic students to feel prepared and upbeat for their future job search and career
- Nonbinary students and those that preferred to self describe their gender reported feeling less prepared and less upbeat for their future job search and career



METHODOLOGY

- The UC Graduate Student Experience Survey (UCGSES) is administered every two years, beginning in 2021, and covers a wide range of topics related to graduate student experiences
- This report exclusively cites data from the 2023 administration
- The response rate was 26% and was generally representative of the graduate student population
