

Use of Proposition 56 Funding: 2018-2019 Appropriation

In 2018, University of California Health (UCH) entered into an agreement with Physicians for a Healthy California (PHC) for the purpose of developing, administering, and managing a statewide Graduate Medical Education (GME) grant program (known as “CalMedForce”) created and funded by Proposition 56.

Application Period: December 12, 2018 through January 15, 2019

Award notification: January 30, 2019

Total award amount: \$38,195,000

First payment to 2018-2019 awardees sent/approved Fall of 2019. Subsequent payments, over the course of three or four years, are made upon approval of required reports per the CalMedForce program.
