

## Use of Proposition 56 Funding: 2019-2020 Appropriation

In 2018, University of California Health (UCH) entered into an agreement with Physicians for a Healthy California (PHC) for the purpose of developing, administering, and managing a statewide Graduate Medical Education (GME) grant program (known as “CalMedForce”) created and funded by Proposition 56.

**Application Period:** September 23, 2019 through October 28, 2019

**Award notification:** November 25, 2019

**Total award amount:** \$38,085,000

First payment to 2019-2020 awardees sent/approved in Fall of 2020. Subsequent payments, over the course of three or four years, are made upon approval of required reports per the CalMedForce program.

\*Assumed allocation from Prop 56 and State General Funds would total \$40,000,000, however, later found out that backfill funding from the State General Fund was not sufficient to fill the gap of roughly \$2,000,000 shortfall.

<sup>1</sup> Carryforward funds from 2018-2019 appropriation. Includes funds used for additional awardee payments (\$85,000) in 2019-2020 award cycle. These funds have been fully allocated as of June 2019 since total available funds (Prop 56 GME and State General Funds) for 2019-2020 was not \$40 million.

<sup>2</sup> Per the agreement between UC and PHC, \$1,500,000 is paid annually to PHC to manage and administer the CalMedForce program. \$89,211.51 from payment in 2018-2019 to PHC for management of the program was used to cover the expenses in 2019-2020.

<sup>3</sup> Funds allocated to PHC for payment to grant recipients. Payments are made upon approval of required reports, over a three or four-year contract depending on specialty.

<sup>4</sup> Funds claimed by UC award recipients from the November 2025 State Controller's Office report.

<sup>5</sup> Claims submitted for processing to the State Controller's Office and pending as of November 2025.

<sup>6</sup> Funding for this annual workforce review was covered by UC funds.

<sup>7</sup> Total amount once claims submitted to the State Controller's Office are processed and paid.

<sup>8</sup> 40,085,000 was originally committed for grant expenses, assumed total allocation would be \$40,000,000 and included \$85,000 from 18-19 carryforward.

<sup>9</sup> Remainder of committed funds to UC award recipients that were unspent from 2019-2020 award cycle.

<sup>10</sup> After re-examining total funds allocated from Prop 56 and State General Funds, total available funding was less than \$40,000,000. Funds are annually and continuously appropriated, and adjustments were made in the subsequent years to account for deficit in 2019-2020.
